

• CONUS FUSCOLINEATUS. Fig. 6.

Testa ovato-turbanata, laevis, antice attenuata, postice rotundata, albida, epidermide latea induita, lineis angustis, fuscis, transversis, plus minusve interruptis, ornata, ad apicem maculis granibus, fuscis, irregularibus, pecta. Spira brevissime obtusa; anfractus haud carinati. Apertura medioeriter lata, intus purpureo-fusco late trifasciata.

Long. 22, maj. diam. 12 mm.

Hab.—Sierra Leone.

In form this shell closely resembles *C. mercator*, a well-known and variable West African species, but the pattern, consisting of dark brown transverse lines, is entirely different from that of any of the numerous varieties of that species.
